 - 一语法结构或词汇方面应用基本准确,些许错误主要是因尝试较复杂语法结构或词汇所 致。
 - 一应用简单的语句间的连接成分, 使全文结构紧凑。
- 第三档(11~15分):基本完成了试题规定的任务,基本达到了预期的写作目的。
 - 一虽漏掉一些内容,但覆盖所有主要内容。
 - 一应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。
 - 一有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误, 但不影响理解。
 - 一应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文内容连贯。
- 第二档 (6~10分): 未适当完成试题规定的任务, 信息未能清楚地传达给读者。
 - 一漏掉或未描述清楚一些主要内容,写了一些无关内容。
 - 一语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。
 - 一有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响了对写作内容的理解。
 - 一较少使用语句间的连接成分,内容缺少连贯性。
- 第一档(1~5分): 未完成试题规定的任务, 信息未能传达给读者。
 - 一明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,原因可能是未理解试题要求。
 - 一语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。
 - 一较多语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响对写作内容的理解。
 - 一缺乏语句间的连接成分,内容不连贯。
 - 不得分(0分): 未能传达给读者任何信息: 内容太少,无法评判; 写的内容均与所要求内容无关或所写内容无法看清。
